



**NOTICE OF APPEAL HEARING OF
City of Eugene Traffic Engineer Administrative Order No. 58-10-17**

On **Friday, June 3, 2011, at 3:00 p.m.** the Eugene Hearings Official will consider two appeals of Administrative Order No. 58-10-17, an administrative order of the City of Eugene Traffic Engineer that expands the boundaries of the residential permit parking Zone A in the South University Neighborhood Association (SUNA) area. The appeal hearing will be held at the Lane Council of Governments, located on the fifth floor of the Park Place Building in downtown Eugene, 859 Willamette St., Eugene, Oregon.

Nature of Appeals and Relief Sought:

Appeal #1: Challenges the expanded boundaries of the 2 hour parking limit on the grounds that it is an unnecessarily harsh parking restriction. Believes that there is a better, more creative way, to address the problem with “all day parkers.” Requesting a solution that is “appropriate to the problem of all day parkers but does not place an undue burden or cause economic harm as the current proposal will.”

Appeal #2: Challenges the expanded boundaries of the 2 hour parking on the grounds that it makes it impossible to have guests during the day for more than 2 hours, will cause overnight guests to worry about tickets and will result in renters packing their driveways and lawns with cars. Challenges the City’s process for adopting the administrative order on the grounds that the City failed to determine whether the residents of the neighborhood wanted this change. Requesting that the 2-hour parking limitation not be applied around his properties at 2174 Alder and 2193 Alder and that, before signs are installed, every property owner in the neighborhood (minimally Alder Street) be asked whether they want the zoning restriction.

Geographic Area of Expanded Zone A

The area shown on the map included with this Notice depicts the Residential Permit Parking Zone A, as expanded by Administrative Order No. 58-10-17. The SUNA properties previously designated as residential permit parking Zone A are shown together with the expanded boundaries of the parking zone.

Availability of Staff Report & Appellants’ Documents

Prior to the appeal hearing, City of Eugene staff will provide an appeal hearing packet of all materials to the Hearings Official on this matter. The City’s staff report, copies of the appeals and all documents relied on by the appellants will be available for review by **1:00 p.m., Wednesday, June 1, 2011**. To review the documents for free, stop by PW Maintenance, Building 15, 1820 Roosevelt or the Permit and Information Center, 99 West 10th Avenue (open between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.). Copies can be provided at the City’s standard copying charge.

Options for Submitting Testimony

1. Send a written statement to the Hearings Official, c/o Tom Larsen, Traffic Engineer, PW Maintenance, Building 15, 1820 Roosevelt, Eugene, Oregon 97402, or by E-mail at: tom.c.larsen@ci.eugene.or.us. For testimony to be included in the Appeal Hearing packet prepared before the hearing and provided to the Hearings Official, the written statements must be received by **1:00 p.m., Tuesday, May 31, 2011**.
2. Submit a written statement at the appeal hearing.
3. Attend the appeal hearing and speak to the Hearings Official. Your spoken testimony will be recorded.

Failure to raise an issue at the appeal hearing in one of the above-three ways, or failure to provide enough specificity to give the Hearings Official an opportunity to respond to the issue, prevents appeal of the decision on that issue. A person receiving this notice waives the right to protest the administrative action if the person fails to appeal in person or in writing at the hearing.

Appellants Only: Any physical evidence (including but not limited to written materials, photographs, video tapes, models, maps) that **the appellants** intend to present at the hearing **must** be filed with Tom Larsen by **1:00 p.m., Tuesday, May 31, 2011**.

Appeal Hearing Procedure

The appeal hearing will be conducted in accordance with Administrative Order No. 58-92-01, Procedures for Appeal Traffic Control Administrative Actions Rule R.5.045. Pursuant to R.5.045-C.7, the Hearings Official will conduct the hearing in the following manner:

1. Commence the hearing.
2. Receive into the record staff notes, reports and other documents submitted prior to the hearing.
3. City staff summary.
4. Appellants' testimony.
5. Interested persons' testimony.
6. City staff presentation and recommendations.
7. Rebuttal evidence from appellants.
8. Close or continue the hearing.

The Hearings Official will render a decision in writing, based on the criteria in Section 5.055 of the Eugene Code. The decision will be filed with the City Recorder and a copy thereof mailed to the appellants and all persons who testified orally or in writing at the hearing.

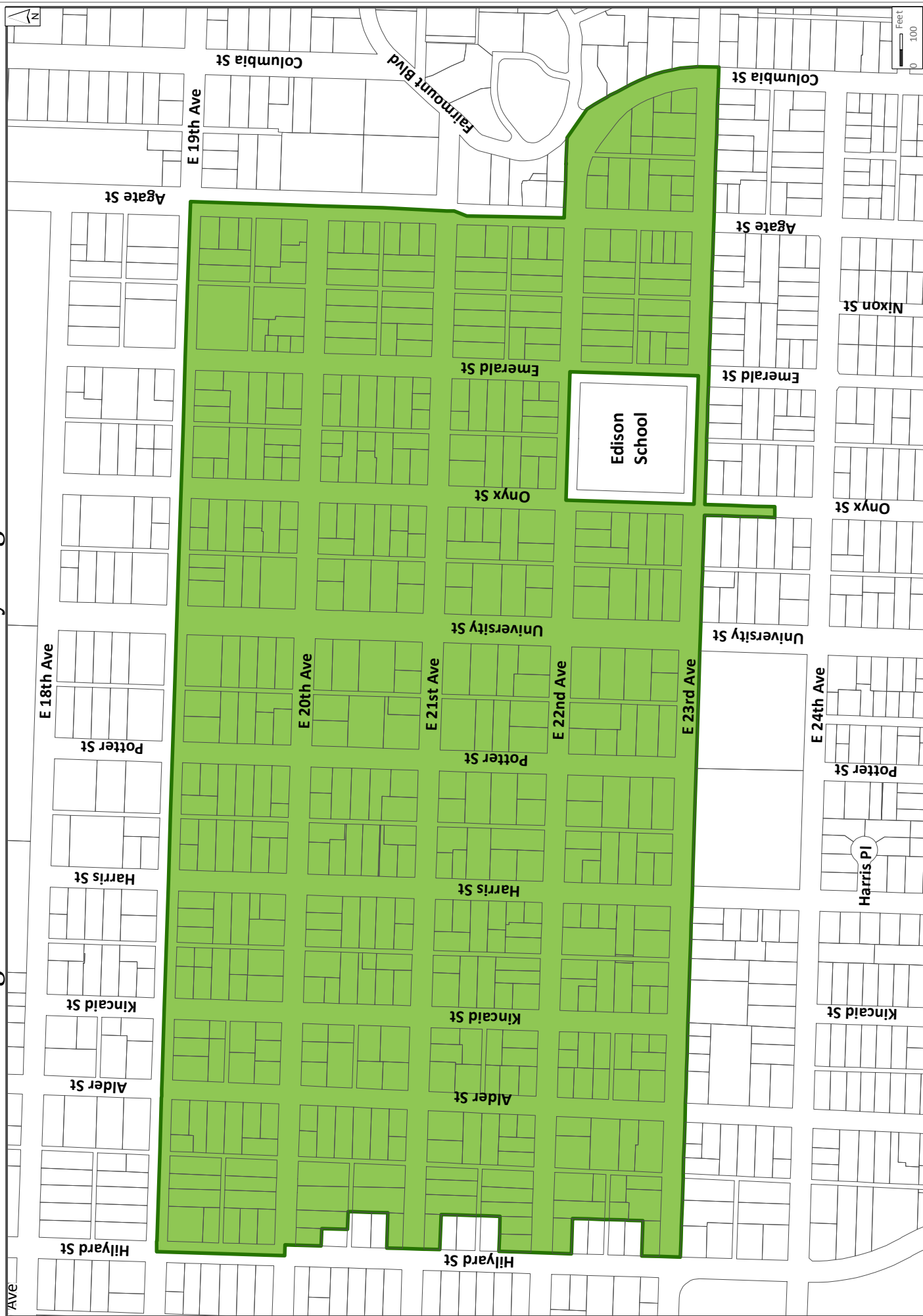
