Naloxone (Narcan)

12.18.1 PURPOSE AND SCOPE

The Eugene Police Department provides Naloxone (Narcan) to those employees who choose to carry it. This procedure outlines the requirements of the department, and those employees who choose to carry this tool.

12.18.2 USE

Naloxone will only be carried and administered in accordance with the standards taught in training.

12.18.3 ISSUANCE

Any EPD employee who completes the Naloxone training may be issued a single dose of Narcan. Additionally, a single dose will be placed with each AED at EPD facilities.

The Quartermaster is responsible for the issuance of Naloxone, and maintaining a replacement inventory.

When an employee administers Naloxone, they must request a replacement unit from the Quartermaster.

12.18.4 REPORTING

Employees are expected to notify dispatch via radio as soon as reasonably possible, and responding medics in person as soon as reasonably possible, that Naloxone was administered.

When Naloxone is used, and a police report is being written, the use of Naloxone shall be noted in the police report. If no report is written, officers shall notify their supervisor of the use as soon as practical and an FI card completed with a synopsis of the incident.

12.18.5 TRAINING

Training will be conducted with the regularly scheduled CPR/First Aid/Tourniquet training and recertification. Employees who intend to carry/use Naloxone are required to attend this training. The Office of Professional Standards Lieutenant is responsible for ensuring this training is conducted.
