### INTRODUCTION

The City of Eugene offers a wide variety of services to the public and many specialized programs that are described in this manual. The City has self-insured the liability and workers' compensation programs since 1979. As a result, we have developed comprehensive loss prevention and loss control programs throughout the City. We are proud of the success of these programs and of our employees' broad understanding and support of the concept of risk management.

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## Risk Management Accomplishments

This summary of significant accomplishments demonstrates the organization's commitment to safety and risk management.

### City of Eugene Achieves Silver Safety Award

In October 2015 the League of Oregon Cities and Citycounty Insurance Services (CIS) recognized the safe work performance by City of Eugene employees with a Silver Safety Award. The City has received a safety award annually since 2000. The award is based upon the number of lost-time injury cases per 100 employees.

### Risk Management Awards

Risk Services staff continually look for ways to improve our program and services. Risk Services has received three Achievement Awards from the Public Risk & Insurance Management Association (PRIMA) for outstanding products: the annual Risk Report, the Risk Services website, and a first place award for the Insurance Marketing Manual. ### City Holds Excellent ISO Building Code Effectiveness Grading Schedule (BCEGS®) Rating

The Building Code Effectiveness Grading Schedule (BCEGS®) assesses the building codes in effect in a particular community and how the community enforces its building codes, with special emphasis on mitigation of losses from natural hazards.

The concept is simple: municipalities with well-enforced, up-to-date codes should demonstrate better loss experience, and insurance rates can reflect that. The prospect of lessening catastrophe-related damage and ultimately lowering insurance costs provides an incentive for communities to enforce their building codes rigorously — especially as they relate to windstorm and earthquake damage.

The BCEGS program assigns each municipality a grade ranging from 1 (exemplary commitment to building-code enforcement) to 10. Eugene holds a grade of 2 for single and double family dwellings, and 2 for all other construction.

### City of Eugene Named Among Top Ten Healthiest Employers in Oregon

In 2015, the City of Eugene was named one of Oregon's top ten healthiest employers of its size by the *Portland Business Journal*. The award was created to recognize organizations with innovative wellness programs and worksite wellness initiatives. ### Public Works Department APWA Accreditation

The Eugene Public Works Department is an accredited agency through the American Public Works Association and was the first APWA accredited agency in Oregon. A major component of the accreditation process focused on the Public Works Safety Program.



### National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) and Community Rating System (CRS)

The City's participation in the NFIP and CRS programs provides a direct benefit to the community. As a Class 7 CRS community, flood insurance premiums for structures and contents within the Special Flood Hazard Area are automatically reduced by 15 percent, while those outside the Special Flood Hazard Area receive a five percent discount. The CRS rating provides a standard benchmark for measuring the provision of storm water and flood hazard mitigation services. ### City's Fleet & Radio Services Team Achieve National Recognition

For the 7<sup>th</sup> consecutive year, the City of Eugene Fleet and Radio Communication Services section was recognized by the **100 Best Fleets Program** and *Government Fleet* magazine as being one of the top 100 Public Fleets in North America for 2015. This national program looks critically at performance measures in multiple areas of a public fleet's operation and includes: service delivery, employee support, performance management and cost competitiveness.

In addition, Fleet Services has retained an **EcoBiz certified fleet operation** certification since 2011. The Ecological Business Program (Eco-Biz) is sponsored by the Lane County Pollution Prevention Coalition and recognizes both public and private organizations that reach the highest standards in minimizing their impact on the environment.

### City of Eugene, Financial Achievement Awards

The Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) has awarded the City the **Distinguished Budget Presentation Award** for the past 37 years, and the **Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting** every year since 1976. These awards reflect the City's commitment to achieve the highest principles of governmental budgeting, accounting and procurement.

## The City of Eugene

### OVERVIEW

The City of Eugene, the county seat of Lane County, was incorporated in 1862. The city covers approximately 42 square miles in Lane County. The current population estimate places Eugene as the second largest city in the state, with a 2015 certified estimate population of 163,400 ([Population Research Center, Portland State University](#)).

Eugene operates under a home-rule charter that provides specific and general powers for conducting the City's business through an elected Council and appointed City Manager. The Council-Manager form of government clearly separates the legislative policy function from the professional administrative function.

The Mayor is the formal representative of the City and is elected to a four-year term by the voters at large on a nonpartisan ballot. The Mayor presides over Council meetings and does not vote, except in the case of a tie, and has veto power over Council action.

The City Council is composed of eight nonpartisan Councilors elected to four-year terms. One Councilor is elected from each of the eight wards in the city, with one-half of the Council elected every two years. The Council's authority extends over all the City's powers. The Council takes official action at regular Council meetings, which are open to the public. Neither the Mayor nor the Councilors receive a salary. Since Eugene operates under the Council-Manager form of government, the Council is responsible for selecting a City Manager.

The Manager is appointed for an indefinite term. By charter, the City Manager is responsible for the business, financial and property transactions of the City, preparation of the annual budget, appointment and supervision of all personnel, enforcement of City ordinances and the organization and general management of City departments. As chief administrator, the City Manager has no vote in the Council, but may participate in their discussions.

### SERVICES TO THE PUBLIC

Under the direction of the City Manager, City services are provided by six departments. These departments are categorized into four service areas that provide services directly to the public. Following is a description of the four service categories:

**Cultural & Leisure Services:** Provides a variety of materials and services that meet the information, education and recreation needs of the community; manages a wide range of recreation, cultural and leisure services and resources; promotes the social and aesthetic character of the community; and operates diverse City facilities, including recreation/ senior centers, performing arts venues, library, park/athletic facilities and swimming pools.



**Public Safety Services:** Provides for protection of constitutional guarantees; provides for community security and statutory enforcement and professional assistance to deter unlawful and disorderly conduct; provides fire and emergency medical protection to the City and contracting districts; provides 911 emergency dispatching services for the City and surrounding county area; promotes a safer environment through crime, fire and arson prevention public education and information programs; and acts as the judicial branch of the City to adjudicate municipal code enforcement and state traffic and parking laws, as adopted by municipal ordinance.



**Development Services:** Provides for development and maintenance of the City's physical infrastructure (transportation systems, wastewater and storm water collection and treatment facilities) and operation of the Eugene Airport; and provides land use planning, building and permit services, parking and services to local businesses such as expansion financing and assistance in qualifying for state property tax exemption benefits.



**Central Business Functions:**

Provides centralized business support services to the City Manager, City Council and City departments so that they may successfully serve the public and direct services to the public



in support of the organization and other service categories. These services include human resource and risk management services, Council and intergovernmental services, financial services, organizational systems analysis, and information management and processing. This area supports the Council's priority to maintain a sound financial management program, including the implementation of alternative operating and capital revenue strategies and the financing for major capital construction or acquisition.

**MANAGEMENT**

The City of Eugene's emphasis on sound management and strategic planning has placed it at the leading edge of municipal management in a variety of areas ranging from employee relations, automation and internal communications. Prudent and conservative financial management policies, practices, long range planning and forecasting enable the City to direct its future. State and local statutes combined with internal management policies to provide for an accountable and open form of government.



**CITIZEN INVOLVEMENT**

The citizens of Eugene are the most important part of the City organization. Councilors are elected by the citizens to represent their interests on the Council, and City services are directed to meet their needs. Public hearings are routinely held so that citizens can contribute to the planning and budgeting process of City issues. The Mayor, Council and department staff also appoint citizens to advise them on various specialized subjects and issues through citizen advisory committees. For financial planning and monitoring, Oregon Local Budget Law requires a Budget Committee consisting of eight Councilors and eight lay members. The Budget Committee reviews the Executive Budget Recommendation and recommends a budget to the Council.



**STATE, LEGAL, & PROFESSIONAL FINANCIAL GUIDELINES**

The City maintains financial records in compliance with Oregon local budget law and professional accounting standards and practices as established by Generally Accepted Accounting Principals promulgated by the Government Accounting Standards Board. Management is guided by financial strategies, plans, policies and budgets sanctioned or adopted by the City Council.



**MANAGEMENT/STAFF**


Executive level recruitments are conducted nationally, while mid-manager and professionals are recruited largely from the western United States. Technical and clerical staff are recruited from the local area. Staff are selected on the basis of technical and professional competency and capacity to grow and contribute to the organization. The City provides a variety of training opportunities to maintain and enhance skills or explore career development options.

**EMPLOYEES**

The City employs 2,143 regular and temporary employees, of whom 995 are represented by bargaining units. There are 402 managerial, supervisory, confidential and professional employees who are not represented in the collective bargaining process. The City is a market-based employer and routinely evaluates its salary position to the relevant market. The City has not had an employee strike in over 41 years of formal contract negotiations.

**RISK MANAGEMENT PROGRAM****PROGRAM MISSION & PHILOSOPHY**

➤ Provide strategic guidance and advice to the organization on risk issues in order to assist the organization in achieving its goals. Our goal is to foster a culture of proactive risk management throughout the organization, creating an environment where risks and opportunities are identified and managed effectively.

➤ Assist the organization in safeguarding the City's property, financial and human resources from the adverse impact of loss by purchasing insurance, responding to and resolving risk claims and developing programs, plans and procedures to make the organization safer and more resilient.

The City's risk management program is built upon a philosophy developed and promoted by the Risk Services staff:

**"The success of our program depends on our ability to instill in each City employee an awareness and acceptance of his or her responsibility for creating a safe and healthy environment in which to work and live."**

**PROGRAM RESPONSIBILITIES**

The Risk Services Division of the Central Services Department is responsible for the identification, evaluation, treatment, and monitoring of the City's operational risks. Risk Services includes the following program areas:

- **emergency management**
- **employee benefits**
- **employee health and fitness**
- **general and auto liability**
- **property and other miscellaneous insured risks**

- **safety, loss control and environmental services**
- **unemployment insurance**
- **workers' compensation**

The City is extremely pleased with the success of the risk management program. The program works well because of the strong organizational commitment to the goals and values expressed in the mission statement and operating philosophy.

**PROGRAM OVERVIEW**

The City's Risk Management program has a **strong administrative foundation** including the following:

- **Administrative Policy Manual** outlining Risk policies;
- A comprehensive **training program** for employees and supervisors;
- **Award-winning website** available to all employees;
- Management of the **Risk Fund** created in the Municipal Code to fund losses of the City's **self-insured liability, workers' compensation and health insurance programs**;
- Risk Fund reserves are established by **annual actuarial analysis**;
- The workers' compensation and liability programs are **self-insured**;
- The liability program is **self-administered** and is responsible for claims under the Oregon Tort Claims Act (OTCA), which outlines the City's liability for acts committed by our officers, agents or employees acting within the course and scope of their employment. - **Annual cost allocation system** allocates risk costs to City department based on loss history and exposure to risk.



Beyond this strong foundation is a program based on the fundamental principles of risk management: **risk identification, evaluation, treatment, and monitoring.**



### Risk Identification

The City uses the traditional methodologies and tools for identifying exposures to loss. These include budget and planning documents, inventories of assets, risk appraisals of real property, and interviews with staff. In addition, the following special risk identification programs are in place:

The City acknowledges **safety committees** as a valuable resource for the identification and correction of potential safety-related loss exposures. Safety committees conduct safety audits and are involved in the accident review process to identify and eliminate the causes of accidents.

As part of the **hearing conservation program**, Risk staff routinely tests worksite and equipment noise levels. Where risk of hearing loss exists, employees are tested on a regular basis to detect any change in hearing capacity. There is annual in-house audiometric testing of over 100 employees.

The most effective source of loss identification comes from information provided by employees in each department. **Reports from employees** provide steady input about possible sources of property damage or potential liability for the City. If an employee identifies a hazard on the street, an officer investigates a motor vehicle accident in which City property is damaged or destroyed, or receives a threat of 'suit' from a hostile suspect, the information is sent to Risk Services for follow-up. Annual supervisor training sessions provide another opportunity for Risk Services to publicize how employees in the field can assist with loss identification and recovery of damages.

### Risk Evaluation

Once exposures to loss have been identified, the next essential step in the risk management process is to evaluate the risks in terms of the **frequency and severity of potential losses**. Risk Services staff evaluates general liability, property, unemployment and workers' compensation claims for each department on an annual basis.

Each executive, division manager and supervisor receives the annual **Risk Report** showing frequency and severity of workers' compensation and liability claims that their department has incurred over the past five years as compared to the City's total frequency and severity to show them the risks associated with their department's activities.

In addition, the report contains information on the type of claims, activity at the time of injury and loss control services provided to the department during the year. Risk Services has also identified **performance measures** which are published in the City's annual budget and in the Risk Report.

In 2014, a **study of police officer workers' compensation claims** was conducted to formulate injury prevention strategies. The study won an honorable mention from the Public Risk Management Association (PRIMA) for Outstanding Achievement in the *Public Risk Management Product* category.

### Risk Treatment

The treatment of risk at the City of Eugene can be categorized into four primary strategies: **loss prevention, loss reduction, and loss transfer/retention.**

#### Loss Prevention

Loss prevention and loss reduction are truly the hallmarks of the City of Eugene risk management program. The following summary briefly describes some of the loss prevention programs developed by the Risk Services staff.

The City has established a **"Safety & Security Improvement Program"** to help fund worksite improvements and purchase safety-related equipment and to help fund facility security enhancements for which the departments have not budgeted.

The City also maintains a separate **"Injury Prevention Fund"**, which was created to assist departments in taking immediate action to minimize or prevent potential injuries. Requests describing emergent situations that could affect many employees and/or could have extreme consequences to the organization will receive funding priority, although non-emergent projects such as ergonomic improvements can also be considered if funding allows. The fund is administered through Risk Services, and requests are ultimately approved solely at the discretion of the Risk Services Division Manager.

The City of Eugene has received **safety awards** from the *League of Oregon Cities* annually since 2000.

The **CPR/First Aid training course** has continued to provide City employees with skills valuable to them at home, as well as at work. Presently over one third of all City employees are certified in CPR/First Aid. This training offers the additional benefit of increased safety awareness. **Automated External Defibrillators (AED)** are available at various City locations and training has been provided in the use of this emergency device. **Blood borne pathogens** awareness has increased the interest in this training as it demonstrates the proper and safe methods of providing first aid.

The **Employee Health and Fitness Program** is nationally recognized for its unusual breadth, complexity and acceptance by employees. Program components include health/risk assessments, blood chemistry analysis, dietary analysis, fitness assessments, life-style and fitness prescriptions, educational classes, injury rehabilitation, stress management, pre-employment testing, and ergonomic job site evaluations. This program won a **Fitness Leadership Award** from the *Oregon Governor's Council on Physical Fitness and Sports*. In addition, the City has a wellness center and exercise facilities in all fire stations, the police department and other locations

In an effort to help employees handle the pressures of living in today's world, the **Employee Assistance Program (EAP)** offers professional services in the areas of problem identification, short-term counseling, referral and case management to employees and family members. The program, specifically designed to help resolve problems before they result in lost job productivity, absenteeism, health problems, and accidental injury, was designed and implemented under Risk Services' leadership.

The **environmental loss prevention program** continues to expand in scope. All City-owned underground storage tanks have been inventoried, registered with the *Oregon Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ)* and meet current EPA standards. The City performs Phase 1 environmental assessments for property being considered for purchase or development and consults on City construction projects which may involve environmental contamination to ensure compliance with Oregon DEQ rules.

The City has also instituted a **driving record review** of all prospective employees who will drive City vehicles as part of their jobs. Using standard insurance industry criteria, individuals with unacceptable driving records are not allowed to drive City vehicles. In addition, the City participates in the Oregon State Department of Motor Vehicles' **Automated Reporting System (ARS)** system that provides regular reports of all employees who have received citations. This enables Risk to notify supervisors of the current status of employees' driving records. The City complies with Federal Transit Administration (FTA) requirements for random drug testing for employees who hold a commercial drivers license as a job requirement and other City drivers who may fall under FTA regulations.

In addition, the City of Eugene has been proactive in adopting effective **personnel policies** including policies prohibiting weapons, violence, smoking, harassment and discrimination in the workplace. The City also provides training in all of these areas for employees, supervisors, and managers.

The **Eugene Police Department** is committed to providing the best tools and techniques necessary for each police officer to be successful in performing his or her job duties. Eugene Police officers are required to complete State (DPSST certified) training, a four month in-service Field Training and Evaluation Program, and attend additional training addressing current concerns such as community policing, diversity, officer safety, emotional survival and many more important topics. After the officers graduate from the academy, they attend ongoing in-service training annually.

The Risk Services' **Safety & Loss Control Program** provides a variety of services targeted at assuring a safe and healthy work environment for City employees, City-owned assets, and for the general public, including the following:

- Develops/administers City safety policies to assure compliance with local, state and federal regulations
- Reviews workers' compensation claims and accident reports
- Conducts incident investigations and develops corrective action plans
- Evaluates operations, equipment and facilities
- Reviews procedures and required personal protective equipment
- Supports a joint labor/management safety committee and department and division safety committees
- Provides air quality monitoring and noise level testing
- Provides training for employees and supervisors

Additional loss prevention programs in place at the City include:

- Testing of sprinkler and fire prevention systems
- Conducting background checks on job applicants
- Addressing building security via a prox card key lock system
- Driver training programs
- Regular elevator testing/inspection

### **Loss Reduction**

The Risk Services Division includes the **Emergency Management Program**. The **Emergency Manager** manages and coordinates all of the City's emergency management activities. The Emergency Manager leads the activities of the City's **Disaster Operations Task Team (DOTT)**, which includes representatives from all departments.

In recognition of the City's need to mitigate, prepare for, respond to and recover from natural, technological and civil emergencies the DOTT regularly reviews and updates the **Emergency Management Plan**. The plan is exercised in "table top" drills as well as fully functional drills. Intended to reduce the severity of loss to the City, community and citizens, the plan addresses operational responsibilities for each City department. In the area of workers' compensation, the cost to both the employee and the organization are minimized by an **aggressive and effective return-to-work program**. Risk Services staff work closely with the injured employee, supervisor, and medical service provider to ensure that proper medical care is received and that the employee is returned to a light duty assignment as soon as possible after the injury.

**In-house administration of the liability claims program** has proven to be very cost-effective for the City of Eugene, while offering fast, responsive service to claimants.

Risk Services actively pursues **recovery claims for damage to City property** caused by third parties when a responsible party and/or insurance coverage can be identified. Over the past five years a total of \$860,761 has been recovered while spending only about \$20,000 per year in staff time to pursue these claims. The funds collected are returned directly to the affected City work units throughout the year to offset expenses for replacement stock and equipment.

#### **Risk Transfer/Retention**

Recognizing that losses will occur in spite of our best preventative efforts, the City's risk management program uses a mixture of **self-insurance and insurance techniques** to maximize cost efficiencies, cash flow, and coverage.

##### **SELF-INSURED RETENTIONS**

- **Workers' Compensation—\$1,000,000**  
with statutory limits of excess coverage
- **Liability:**
  - **General/Auto Liability—\$1,000,000**
  - **Wrongful Acts—\$1,000,000**
  - **Employment—\$1,000,000**  
with excess coverage of \$10,000,000

Reserves for self-insured claims are funded based on an annual **actuarial analysis** of the City's claims liability.

**Fully insured** exposures to loss include:

- \$300 million per occurrence all-risk property insurance coverage as well as:
  - \$100 million boiler/machinery
  - \$75 million earthquake
  - \$50 million flood
  - \$500,000 public official's bond
  - \$1 million employee fidelity bond
  - \$6 million fiduciary liability insurance
  - \$60 million airport general liability insurance

#### **Risk Monitoring**

Risk Services staff realize that the constant monitoring of risk treatment strategies is important to assure that they are implemented correctly and that the desired results are achieved.

The workers' compensation and liability **automated claims systems** make comprehensive loss information reports readily available. These reports are reviewed monthly by Risk Services staff to identify and evaluate loss trends in terms of both frequency and severity.

Reviews of departmental risk management programs and claims experience are reported in the annual **Risk Report**. In addition, executive and division managers receive **monthly reports of all workers' compensation, liability and property claims**. #### **Conclusion**

The City of Eugene has a long established, successful risk management program that works closely with all City departments to identify, prevent and control losses.



## ***The Risk Services Team***

The City of Eugene's risk management program was established in 1978 and Risk Services is a division of the Central Services Department. Over the years, Risk Services has grown from a single staff function to include:

**Risk Services Division Manager:** The Risk Services Division Manager is responsible for all division administration including risk finance, program planning, budgeting, staffing, implementation, and monitoring. The central focus of the Risk Services Division Manager's role is coordination of the Risk program areas in order to maintain the highest standards of risk management possible for the organization.

**Risk Claims Manager:** The Risk Claims Manager is responsible for managing the City's self-insured, self-administered liability program, managing the City's self-insured workers' compensation program, and overseeing the processing of disabling workers' compensation claims by the City's third party administrator. In addition, the Risk Claims Manager consults with and assists attorneys on complex and litigated claims, educates employees and supervisors regarding the claims programs, and coordinates the City's return-to-work program.

**Liability/Property Claims Analyst:** The Liability/Property Claims Analyst is responsible for administering self-insured liability and property claims. The Claims Analyst also administers the City's unemployment insurance program and third-party recovery claims program for damage to City property. In addition, the Claims Analyst coordinates airport, property, boiler and machinery, medical malpractice, fidelity claims administration and contract review.

**Risk Services Program Coordinator:** The Risk Services Program Coordinator assists with overseeing the processing of non-disabling workers' compensation claims by the City's third party administrator, works closely the Safety/Loss Control & Environmental Program Manager on OSHA reporting, works with all other members of the Risk Services team, and assists in the administration of the City's insurance, risk management, and claims programs.

**Safety/Loss Control & Environmental Program Manager:** The Safety/Loss Control & Environmental Program Manager is responsible for development and implementation of the Safety & Loss Control program to address safety and environmental issues impacting the City and to minimize liability. In addition, The Safety/Loss Control & Environmental Manager facilitates the delivery of services including safety training, accident investigation, OR-OSHA compliance and reviews, analyzes and monitors real property transactions for potential environmental liability.

**Emergency Management Program Manager:** The Emergency Management Program Manager is responsible for the development, implementation, and evaluation of the City's emergency preparedness program. This includes the maintenance of the City's Emergency Management Plan; and emergency preparedness, response, and recovery activities. The Emergency Management Program Manager also leads the Disaster Operations Task Team (DOTT).

**Emergency Management Senior Program Coordinator:** The Senior Program Coordinator for Emergency Management assists the Emergency Manager in all aspects of the Emergency Management Program and coordinates the Eugene-Springfield Community Emergency Response Team (CERT).

### ***The Risk Services Team (cont.)***

**Employee Health & Fitness Director:** The Employee Health and Fitness Director provides fitness testing, personal fitness prescriptions, and health and wellness educational programs to all City employees. In addition, the Employee Health & Fitness Director manages the Wellness Center, supervises medically prescribed fitness programs for injured employees, and administers the Hearing Conservation and Blood borne Pathogen Programs.

**Benefits Supervisor:** The Benefits Supervisor is responsible for of the City's employee benefit programs and supervision of employee benefits staff, including communication of benefit policies and programs to employees, developing and implementing program enhancements, coordinating enrollment and applications for the various benefit programs.

**Senior Benefits Coordinator:** The Senior Benefits Coordinator communicates benefit policies and programs to employees, manages premium payments related to employee insurance benefits and reconciles bank accounts, administers the FMLA/OFLA program, and assists employees with benefits-related questions or issues.

**Benefits Administrative Specialist:** The Benefits Administrative Specialist provides staff support for the Employee Benefits and Health & Fitness programs.

**City of Eugene Vehicle Maintenance Program Overview**  
The City's Fleet Services section maintains over 693 licensed vehicles and rolling stock and 370 pieces of maintenance and construction equipment, ranging from subcompact sedans to 30-ton trucks. Thirty-five percent of the vehicle fleet is dedicated to Public Safety (police cars, motorcycles, ambulances, fire apparatus). The Fleet Services section is also responsible for maintenance of more than 2,118 pieces of communications equipment. Repair, parts warehousing, inventory control and fuel distribution are also provided.

**Replacement**

The need for replacement of the vehicles is determined by equipment age, accumulated mileage/hours, cost of operation, technological obsolescence, energy efficiency, utilization and replacement cost.

**Preventive Maintenance**

Scheduled preventive maintenance is as follows:

- ▶ Vehicles (auto/light trucks) - 5,000 miles or 12 months
- ▶ Police patrol units, ambulances - 3,000 miles
- ▶ Street sweepers/flushers - 200 hours
- ▶ Fire pumpers, aerial trucks - every 6 months
- ▶ Construction/other specialized equipment - per manufacturer's specs

**Safety**

Any vehicle that develops defects in parts vital to safe operation is removed from service until necessary repairs can be made. City vehicles are only to be used on City business and operated in accordance with State laws and City ordinances. The driving records of City employees are monitored when an employee is required to operate a City vehicle as part of their job. Information is obtained from the State Department of Motor Vehicles Auto Flag system. Complaints regarding employees not operating vehicles in a safe and responsible manner are investigated by Fleet Services and/or the appropriate supervisor for potential disciplinary action.

**City of Eugene Public Buildings & Facilities Program Overview**

The Facility Management Division coordinates the maintenance, operation, and preservation of the City's buildings and facilities. The Division oversees design, construction and maintenance of all City facilities. The facilities total approximately 2 million square feet, and include community centers, fire stations, libraries, performing arts venues, parking garages, swimming pools and park structures, as well as general office buildings.



Design and construction responsibilities include space planning, building design, preparation and management of contract documents, and construction project management. Building operations include custodial services, access control program, and the Downtown Mall/Parks Blocks program.

Maintenance includes carpentry, electrical work, energy management, HVAC maintenance, painting, plumbing, pool maintenance, and roofing maintenance. The City has had a comprehensive energy management program since the mid-1990s, including computerized control of the heating, ventilation and air conditioning systems on a number of the City's largest buildings.

A computerized maintenance management system is used to develop a planned preventive maintenance program that is specific for each of the buildings included in the program. The preventive maintenance program includes fire sprinkler systems, alarm systems, elevators, and automated doors, in addition to building equipment, roofs and exteriors.

A key management practice is to improve the condition of facilities, therefore maximizing the life of each building. A Facility Condition Audit identifies both existing building deficiencies and emerging deficiencies. The Facility Condition Report is used to prioritize the allocation of funds for capital preservation projects, to maximize the benefit of reinvestment in the City's building assets.

The City's property insurance policy is subject to a \$25,000 deductible. Claims under the deductible are paid by the Risk Fund. Claims of \$1,000 or less are paid directly by the department that incurs the loss as a loss prevention incentive. Over the past five years, the insurance company has paid \$19,036 on a wind storm roof loss and \$21,515 on a water damage loss. All other losses fell under the deductible. The graphs below show a five year loss history.




Eugene Police—Forensic Evidence & Property Control Unit

## **SAFETY/LOSS CONTROL & ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES PROGRAM**

The City's Safety/Loss Control & Environmental Services staff assists City departments/divisions with many loss control needs by consulting with them on safety and occupational health. Our staff surveys operations, evaluates exposures and the effectiveness of loss controls and offers suggestions where necessary.

Safety training, education and motivation point the way to a safer, more productive work place. Supervisors play a key role in accident prevention; therefore, they are expected to model safe behavior, reward safe behavior and correct unsafe acts. The Executive Management Team has instituted mandatory safety training for supervisors.

### **SERVICES PROVIDED TO THE ORGANIZATION**

#### **Accident Investigation**

Staff is available to assist in the investigation of auto and occupational injury accidents and will help evaluate and classify accidents in order to identify the cause and reduce the possibility of repetition.

#### **Air Quality Monitoring**

Staff responds to air quality concerns. The City currently has an (HVAC) Systems Technician on staff who can answer heating/air conditioning or general ventilation issues. Most air quality concerns are resolved at this level. If warranted, staff will monitor (or make arrangements for testing) the air in City facilities for Carbon Dioxide, Carbon Monoxide, Oxygen levels or any contaminant that may adversely affect air quality or worker safety and health.

#### **Equipment Evaluation**

Staff visits worksites and evaluates equipment to ensure that safety standards are met. When requested, staff assists with job hazard analyses and evaluates work procedures and methods, including review of personal protective equipment.

#### **OR-OSHA Inspections and Consultative Services**

Staff will participate when a City site is inspected by OR-OSHA, and will serve in an advisory capacity to help correct or abate any identified hazards. Staff will also facilitate the scheduling of OR-OSHA Consultative Services' worksite evaluations.

#### **Noise Level Testing**

Staff is available to test decibel levels on City-owned equipment to ensure that permissible exposure limits are not exceeded. If levels exceed permissible standards, employees using that equipment or working in the affected area of exposure will be entered into the Hearing Conservation Program.

#### **Safety Audits**

Staff will periodically visit City facilities and check the operations, equipment, facilities, first aid supplies and in general identify work place hazards. They will make recommendations to resolve or eliminate hazards or conditions detrimental to worker safety.

#### **Safety Committees**

Safety & Loss Control staff supports the Joint Labor/Management Safety Sub-committee as well as department/division safety committees. Staff assists in the administration of various safety programs and is available to attend safety meetings as a resource for knowledge and interpretation of safety standards. They work with department representatives to formulate and document required written safety programs such as lockout/tag out, respirator usage, confined space entry and many others.



**Safety Training and Education**

Staff is available to keep employees abreast of the safety training standards and to evaluate safety training needs. The primary responsibility for the provision of safety training rests with the departments. Risk Services is prepared to assist in the development and procurement of specialized training materials. Safety & Loss Control provides numerous safety trainings including Hazard Communication, to ensure that workers know how to read labels and Safety Data Sheets (SDS) in order to handle and work with hazardous chemicals safely.

**Trend Analyses**

Accident analyses and trend assessments provide valuable insight for the reduction of visible as well as hidden costs and exposures. Staff prepares annual reports for each department which summarize OR-OSHA/workers' compensation injury and illness data as well as auto accident statistics.

**Environmental Site Assessments**

On-site inspections are conducted by Safety & Loss Control staff for selected property transactions. Staff provides a review of other firms' work performed as part of property reviews, and as needed, will facilitate the scheduling of Phase One or Phase Two site assessments by qualified consultants.

**Underground Storage Tank Management/Decommissioning**

Staff provides project oversight and consultative services to ensure compliance with underground storage tank regulations.

**Waste Identification**

Staff assists in the identification of hazardous wastes and provides for the most effective and safe removal of those wastes. Staff also provides training and other technical assistance related to waste handling and storage issues.

## SAFETY TRAINING PROGRAMS
