March 5 at 1 p.m.
David Wagner: Mosses and ferns

Local botanist David Wagner will lead a nature walk in the forest of Hendricks Park focusing on the spore bearing plants that are most active in winter, including mosses, lichens and ferns.

Emily Steel and Erik Fisher: Celebrate 15 years of forest stewardship

Did you know that there are 12 pedestrian trails, totaling three miles, in the forested natural area of Hendricks Park? Sasha White, native plant gardener, will lead a tour of "native fruits." Learn about the uses of diverse edible and medicinal plants native to the Southern Willamette Valley.

November 5 at 1 p.m.
Chris Melotti and Molly Widmer: Mushrooms

Join founding members of the Cascade Mycological Society, Chris Melotti and Molly Widmer, for a mushroom walk in the forested area of Hendricks Park.
