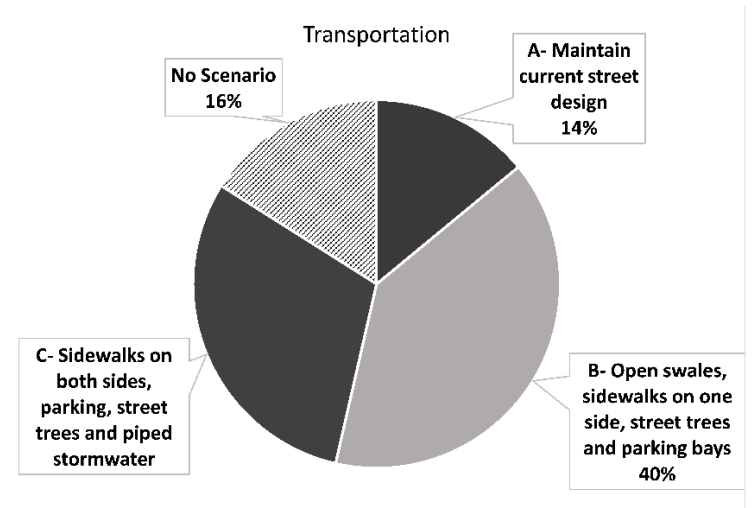
**Draft GOAL 6: Promote safe and accessible transportation for all.**

- Traffic calming

- Easier, safer crossings
- Street lights, less speeding, sidewalks, better safety overall
- More sidewalks without cutting down trees, safe for kids to walk to school and parks
- Sidewalks for schoolkids, mobility devices, etc
- Speed limit signs in neighborhoods
- Safer walkways on the streets that branch off of River Rd
- Safety and noise are issues as traffic on side streets grows
- Better connections to Santa Clara to ease traffic, enforce speed limit
- Lower speed on River Rd
- Irving Rd speed limit is too fast, sidewalks need repair
- Covered LTD stops
- Pedestrian signal at Division/Beaver intersection for people entering bike path
