

Process is expected to be about 2-4 months depending on the public review feedback received. This formal land use review process included the neighborhood applicant review and is being led by Cameron McCarthy Landscape Architecture & Planning. Public workshop #4 meets the requirement for a neighborhood applicant review. There is not a formal exemption process that can be applied to the park development even though the PUD Review is intended for housing developments.



Pedestrian connections favored in order to reduce the number visitors arriving by vehicle.

The temporary sidewalk extension to Shadow View (not shown) will be allowed by the landowner 4J School District, provided that the initial alignment and installation is paid for with the Striker Field park design and installation budget.

Clarification, this is both traffic calming and turn around and would meet all city and public emergency vehicular access needs if implemented.

The traffic calming measures shown are not required based on the transportation study and would need to be paid for with the park budget.

The value of this traffic calming measure is primarily for vehicle turn around.


TRAFFIC CALMING AT ANTIGUA

Overall park budget needs to absorb the design, installation and maintenance costs of the traffic calming and parking shown.


20 CAR PARKING LOT CLOSE TO AMENITIES

Primary parking will be provided on the park site and accessed from Grand Cayman.



Parking and Park Access



According to the traffic analysis performed, traffic calming is NOT warranted along Grand Cayman. However, per city guidelines, traffic calming can be requested by Parks and Open Space if it is directly adjacent to a developed park and if the park development budget allows for it.

Planted vs non-planted traffic circle has not been finalized. Minimizing costs of amenities outside of the park boundary to maximize the park experience is the preferred strategy.

Colored pavement and tree planting bump outs on the west side of Grand Cayman are budgeted for in the current design.


Intersections south of Antigua are not directly across from a developed park and therefore do not qualify for traffic calming requests unless warranted by a traffic analysis.

Request for more trees in "natural area" and along west and south edges of the park.




Design Concept - Informal Tree Layout




Design Concept - Grouped Park Amenities



Wider paths are preferred for circulation and are shown at standard widths pending finalization of the park budget.




Lighting is conceptual and layout locations may adjust during advanced stages of lighting design.





Playground Elements - Big Kid Mound and Climbing Structure




Playground Elements - Big Kid Mound and Climbing Structure





Playground Elements - Lil' Kid Mound and Climbing Structure




Playground Elements - Lil' Kid Climbing Structure and Bucket Swings






















